



Kit condition. Grading is for box and contents. Plan replacement must be stated. MINT- A misnomer, consistently misused for anything collectible. Correct ONLY ON COINS!!! NEW- An article shipped from the manufacturer to a retail outlet. Once it is purchased by the consumer, and removed from the premises, it is no longer NEW. If left in the shrink wrap, and unopened, it becomes, AS NEW (guillow, and others, began this in the Sixties). EXCELLENT- Kit has been opened, contents carefully removed and examined, just as carefully replaced. Box is not squashed, soiled, bent, or picked. (Picked is where a sharp edge has slightly broken, and raised up a bit of the cardboard). VERY GOOD- Box has been opened a number of times, has a couple picks, small dents, but still very crisp and neat. Kit is complete and original. GOOD- Has been opened many times, end flaps have some wear, box has some wear and picks, perhaps a bit of fading, some slight soiling, easily repairable, maybe a wheel or thrustbutton missing, or end flap glued back in place, otherwise, original. No scotch, or masking tape used to repair. The vast majority of kits fall into this category.

FAIR- Has been neglected. Some parts cut out but still there, box mashed, bent, torn. If the irreplacables (printwood, plans, box, perhaps the insignia sheet) are there, the kit is restorable. Lots of work, but if you want the kit.... POOR- Box and plans brittle. All you can do is leave it alone, or cannibalize for printwood, wheels, and such. Better than nothing.

The above is not carved in stone, since some kits will fall in between. And, regardless of experience, many times after mailing, I will wonder, if indeed I graded correctly. The best of us can miss, or overlook, or take for granted, the contents of a kit. KAPA members have return privileges, and you should always get the same with every kit purchased through the mail. I have ordered-"It's got lots of sticks, balsa and stuff...no plan...I don't know if it is all there or not"...and received someone's junk box...which is fine, if it was cheap enough. I do love junk boxes!! They are great fun to paw through!! MODEL ARCHAEOLOGY!! Finding the bones of old kits!! Why did the kid(?) not finish this one?? Why was this Comet ten-cent Aeronca Seaplane #A6 finished, and then crunched up?? Look at this Guillow Seversky..partially covered with silver tissue! Here is a Megow knife... Boy!! A dried out glube of tue! (One of us did say that...still brings a grin to think

A bit about myself...My kit collecting began in 1968-69. At this time, there are more than 700 kits in my collection, ranging from 1932 into War Two. Most are rubber scale, and solid, with only a couple of pre-war gas scale jobs. My wants are from the period 1930 through 1942. I already have nearly everything desired from the War Two period... so, normally, I will only trade pre-war kits for other pre-war kits not in my collection, or to upgrade....

Jim Alaback writes that the iron used for (ugh) Monokote, works well getting into accordion box tops, and inside the ends of the one piece boxes. I don't allow Monokote in my home....!!! SOLID MODEL KIT PRODUCERS OF THE THIRTIES



and the famous Roosevelt Fields.





TWO METHODS OF MAKING PRINTWOOD

The following method of making printwood needs to begin with a warning. It uses ACETONE which is potent stuff. Use ACETONE ONLY IN WELL VENTILATED AREAS AND BE CERTAIN THERE ARE NO FLAMES, PILOT LIGHTS, SPARK PRODUCING MOTORS, TOOLS OR LIGHT SWITCHES IN THE SAME ROOM OR EVEN IN ADJACENT ROOMS. READ AND HEED THE LABEL ON THE CAN AND KEEP THE KIDS AWAY.

To begin (again) start by making a paper pattern of all the parts to be made into printwood, i.e. formers, ribs, keels (if you are using that method of construction), rudder and stabilizer outlines (if you are not laminating them) and so on. Be sure to arrange all the parts so they are oriented with the grain running in the same direction. Remember to layout the parts so they will fit on standard widths of sheetwood, usually 2" or 3", and with parts of the same thickness together.

Now take your pattern to the local instant copy shop and run off at least 8 or 10 copies so you will have enough for several attemps the first time out. Make some light and dark copies so you can see the effect that has on the final product. A note of caution here about copiers. Be sure to check the copier you use by making marks on a sheet of paper that are $6\frac{1}{4}$ " apart. Now make a copy and measure the distance between the marks. If the distance between the marks is 6 5/16" the copier is enlarging by 1%. If the distance is 6 3/16" the copier is reducing by 1%. This is enough to make many parts unuseable. Try to adjust the copier to compensate for the error or try another copier. Many copiers enlarge or reduce slightly even though they are set for 100%.

Back home, cut your copies to the correct width. Select a sheet of balsa of the correct thickness and width and lay a copy on it with the image side in contact with the wood. Now tape across one end so you can lift the other end and lay it back down in exactly the same position - you will see the reason for this in a moment.

Now make a pad about 3" square from a clean rag - not too thick, the pad should have about 6 or 8 layers. Now moisten the pad with Acetone - not dripping or even soaked, just very moist. Holding the pattern down at the un-taped end with one hand, start near the taped end with the pad in the other hand and with moderate speed and pressure slide the pad the length of the pattern. Lift the pattern and, with some luck you will see the parts all printed on the sheet of balsa. You say you can't see them? Lay the pattern back down and with a combination of a wetter pad, more pressure and a slower speed try again. If on the other hand the printing is blurry try another copy with a dryer pad, faster speed and less pressure. Try the lighter and darker copies to see the effect they have. With a little practice you should be able to turn out a sheet of printwood as good or better than those in the kits of the thirties.

The second method of making printwood is to take copies of the patterns and lay them face down on the appropriate sheet of balsa and go over them with an ordinary clothes iron that has been set at the correct heat for cotton. Use moderate speed and pressure. Lift the pattern and the image should be transferred to the wood.

Of the two methods I prefer the one using Acetone. For me it yields the best results.


